

With only 6.9% of UK chargers located in the Southwest, compared to 31% for Greater London, providing EV charging at Cotswolds hospitality venues is becoming ever more important to customers. Combine this with the fact that a majority of visitors to the Cotswolds hail from the London area, there are significant additional revenues available directly from EV charging, and indirectly from secondary spend by attracting more customers to venues.

Burleigh Court is a Grade II Listed, 18-bedroom hotel and restaurant set in idyllic gardens in Brimscombe, less than three miles outside of Stroud. Burleigh Court has partnered with EvieLife to deliver a dual output 22kW fast charger, and with only one other slow charger publicly available between the venue and the centre of Stroud, Burleigh Court is ahead of its competition in the area.

EvieLife conducted a load survey on the ageing existing electrical supply but, with a combination of careful planning and a load management system, was able to provide 2 x 22kW connectors giving EV drivers an average full charge in two

hours. This means Burleigh Court's restaurant visitors can still benefit from the service alongside staying guests. The chargers are managed by EvieLife using advance portal management software.

Director, Simon Austin, said, "We're keen to promote sustainability at Burleigh Court. We use local produce in our restaurant as much as possible including producing our own honey. We were keen to reduce vehicle emissions around our site by attracting EV drivers and EvieLife made the adoption of EV charging as easy as possible so, this partnership made complete sense to us."
